I was able to represent Sri Lanka in the finals of the Evaluation Speech Contest at Chennai and win first place in the Evaluation Speech Contest, Division F in 2018, 2019 and 2022. Also, I became the first runner-up in International Speech Contest, Division F in the year 2019, 2020 and 2021.





# Being a champion speaker, how do you feel about it and can you tell us some remarks about your contest journey as a contestant?

I got the opportunity to learn many techniques about public speaking due to contesting. I am not a person who delivers speeches at club meetings frequently and got the chance to practice speeches when getting ready for contests.

# Can you tell us some tips and tricks that you follow when we talk about contesting at any type of contest?

To get a competitive edge and stand out as a unique speaker, it is significantly important to learn about modern techniques of public speaking from Loastmasters and other sources. Studying the judge's ballot sheet to get a better understanding of the way we can score in the contest is of the utmost importance.

# Can you tell us a little about yourself and your background?

# How did you start your Toastmasters journey, and who motivated you to join Toastmasters?

# Can you tell us some tips and tricks that you follow when contesting at any contest?

I can give you a few tips, but there are no tricks.

The tip is, actually, come up with a good solid script. This might sound like the most obvious thing, but if you thoroughly analyze your own scripts, you will realize that many of them lack the fundamentals of speech writing; structure, point and connection between stories.

So, my tip No. 1 is to invest your time in developing a good script and fine-tuning it.

Tip No. 2: practice and practice with video recording. This is a good way to perfect your delivery.

Tip No. 3: find yourself a mentor / coach.

# How do these accomplishments help you in your day-to-day life or your career?

They definitely made me more confident. Confidence is one thing that is really needed in my career. Once I went on stage and made a speech which made the audience laugh at me, walking into a room of 100 students and doing a lecture seemed easy.

### Finally, what kind of message can you give to our future contestants?

Contest! I hat's the message I can and should give. You have to make that decision to take part in a contest and then you will receive all help and guidance from the club. Siyane Toastmasters Club possesses individuals who can train you and take you all the way up to the district stage. They took me, and they will definitely take you.

I noticed four levers and one critical enabler which governed the transformation within me.

#### 1. Unlearn and relearn

Educational programs (pathways) offered by toastmasters international have been defined in the way that you could start from where you are comfortable with and grow as you move on. However, as a member it is vital for me to

ensure to unlearn what you know and re-learn while doing the projects at each level. Open mindset to accept and apply the adjusting feedback of the evaluators and other members, is paramount.

#### 2. Due diligence

Either you play a role or deliver a speech, it's important for you to make sure that you will prepare yourselves and deliver at your best whenever you take up a role or speech.

#### 3. Grab the opportunities

Toastmasters provide you enormous opportunities to learn and grow through required practical exposure and however, grabbing those opportunities depending on how bold you are. Fortune always favours the bold and therefore, I recommend you not to compromise any of these opportunities you may receive in the form of a leadership role, contest, speaking etc.

#### 4. Apply beyond the fraternity

The most of us became toastmasters to find better versions of ourselves to perform our day-to-day work and grow ourselves beyond the toastmasters fraternity. Hence, no point of learning and practicing within the fraternity as long as you don't apply it for your day-to-day work.

#### **Critical enabler:**

#### Discipline

In order to make your levers move in the right direction, a strong foundation is paramount.

That's why toastmasters have set the foundation through core values namely integrity, respect. Service and excellence with toastmasters' promise. Hence, discipline with core values and an extended ecosystem will keep your focus towards success.

Siyane is not just a club, it's a family for me because I was always treated



### **VOICE POWER - A BOOK REVIEW**



The first chapter focuses on the techniques of sound production, as if the answer to how sound comes out and how we should breathe. Also, the second chapter focused heavily on letters, words, and sentences and how we should divide them into syllables that make their pronunciation very effective. As for the third chapter, it was more like applications on the ground, such as using voice at work, and recording voice messages. It ended with chapter four with general health information for voice care.

The first time I read the book, I did not understand it, and could not complete it, but the second time with insisting on reading it, I understood its basic idea, which revolves around the fact that the writer has special breathing channels that begin with exhalation! Yes, you start with an exhale, and it also claims that focusing on the consonants in pronunciation is better because making your voice is very effective. The rest of the chapter, it was very general information.

The author is an expert in vocals and has worked with a lot of singers, and has done a lot of rehearsals to improve the voices. What I understood was that she worked with singers more than speaker and that I was personally more interested in this.




